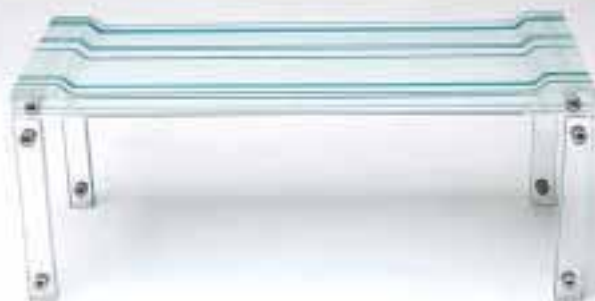
From September 18 until November, a new collection of works made entirely of tempered glass, a first for the French designer Thomas Lemut, will be on show.

Lemut says: "Glass is full of mysteries. I love mystery because I find it nurturing in a way. Last summer, I had the opportunity to visit an industrial glass factory, which inspired me to develop my 'mechanical' design further into a dialect that used sheets of glass. It was after many rejections from glass factories with this new idea, that I finally met Yvon Goude from Goude Glass. Six months were spent just researching the proper temperature, diameter, thickness, etc. in order to temper the glass strips. The result is a unique body of work that challenges glass's structure, function and mystery. An attempt to contribute to the industry through creativity, which I believe, is the core essence of a designer".
